WELCOME TO ROYAL MELBOURNE YACHT SQUADRON

With an illustrious history stretching back to the mid-1870s, Royal Melbourne Yacht Squadron is one of the oldest yacht clubs on Port Phillip Bay, and also one of the friendliest.

A world-renowned venue, RMYS was sailing control centre for the 1956 Melbourne Olympics and more recently hosted the Laser World Sailing Championships in 1999 and World Sailing World Cup final in 2016.

The Squadron boasts a great past, and in 2014 we opened our superb 250 pen floating marina. RMYS continues to host National and State level events including the Australian Yachting Championships and Port Phillip AMS Regatta in 2019.

The shoreside facilities are equally enviable, with an historic clubhouse boasting the refurbished Olympic Room, Harbour Room and the Rooftop, with magnificent 360-degree views of Melbourne and Port Phillip.

A home away from home for local and international sailors, it also provides a stunning venue for weddings, functions and conferences. Exceptional catering is provided by food&desire, the Squadron's long-time, highly-regarded corporate partner.

RMYS is an active club, sailing all year round, with weekend and midweek races together with a growing calendar of events for those who would like to go cruising.

The Squadron has much to offer and invites visitors and prospective members to come and sample the best of sailing that Melbourne has to offer.

Membership of the Squadron offers you the opportunity to be a part of a vibrant social and sailing community located on the foreshore at cosmopolitan St Kilda, and to enjoy modern facilities within an original period building.









A BRIEF HISTORY

The Squadron had its beginnings in the early 1870s when a small group of yachtsmen and occasional fishermen gathered at St Kilda beach. Where there are yachts, there are challenges, and soon informal racing began.

By 1876 the group had become the St Kilda Sailing Club. It was, though, in need of a home. Several early schemes for a club shed were submitted but met with strong opposition from St Kilda residents.

But the club was not deterred, and in December 1885 its persistence was rewarded when the Lands Minister provided a 'Free Grant Site' on West Beach. A weatherboard club shed designed by Sydney Wilson was later built on the site at a cost of one hundred and twenty pounds.

By this stage the club had seen its first name change now being known as the St Kilda Yacht Club – and the tonnage limits were increased to allow larger yachts to participate in races. Soon the club was the strongest on the Bay, with more than 200 members.

It became apparent that a slipway suitable for slipping larger yachts was needed and an application was lodged for a more convenient site closer to the

Although permission was granted, it was another nine years before work started on the construction of the new slipway, which coincided with the building of a new clubhouse.

This two-storey building was designed by a member, J.P. Kennison, and opened by Past Commodore Louis Meyer on 24th June 1905, making the yacht club one of the first in Australia to have an on-site

Soon after the opening, more than 1,200 members and visitors were at the club when the Duke and Duchess of York (later King George VI and Queen Elizabeth), landed at St Kilda.

In May 1924 His Majesty King George V conferred on the club the prefix 'Royal'.

With membership increasing, the club had once more outgrown its facilities and celebrated its Golden Jubilee with the opening of a new clubhouse on 23rd October 1926, the Foundation Stone having been laid by the Governor General, Lord Stonehaven. This building, refurbished and extended in 1996, remains the home of RMYS today.







One of the most momentous years in the club's history was 1956, when Melbourne hosted the Olympic Games. Royal St Kilda Yacht Club was chosen as the Executive Headquarters for the yachting section of the Games and the victory ceremony and presentation of medals took place on the lawns.

The Royal St Kilda Yacht Club amalgamated with the St Kilda 14ft Sailing Club on 6th November 1961, an historic day for the club as it also officially changed its name to the Royal Melbourne Yacht Squadron.

There have been many famous yachts based at the Squadron over the years. An equally promising future seems assured as committee and members take seriously their obligation to respect its traditions while striving wherever and whenever possible to improve the sailing experience for generations to come.

A multi-million dollar investment improving an already exceptional clubhouse experience, and the opening of the magnificent floating marina have helped place RMYS as one of the most progressive and forward-thinking clubs to be found not only in Victoria, but in the whole of Australia



FLOATING MARINA

Royal Melbourne Yacht Squadron officially opened its state-of-the-art 250-berth marina on Sunday 2nd February, 2014.

The completion of this ambitious project was the culmination of 15 years of planning and provides Squadron members with some of the best boating facilities on the Bay.

At a cost in excess of \$14 million, plus incalculable volunteer hours, in addition to the marina itself, a significant amount was spent on extending the breakwater infrastructure. This has been gifted to the people of Victoria, improving the safety of St Kilda Harbour to the benefit of everyone.

Even the needs of the 1,300-strong colony of Little Penguins who make the breakwater their home were considered at all times, disturbance being kept to a minimum due to the environmentally sensitive nature of the project.

RMYS worked alongside Parks Victoria to upgrade the entire St Kilda harbour area and one of the many benefits of the work is the creation of a lasting waterfront legacy that will be enjoyed by generations to come. It is not only Melburnians who will benefit, as more than 8 million tourists annually visit the St Kilda foreshore.

What does this do for Royal Melbourne Yacht Squadron? In essence, it effectively futureproofs the club, cementing its place once more as the go-to club on Port Phillip for those either looking to become a

member, or for sailing visitors from near or far seeking a base from which to explore the delights of St Kilda, Melbourne and the rest of Victoria.

About half of the 250 pens have long term leases while those remaining are available for shorter terms from overnight, a year, or anytime in between. There are also swing moorings available.

The location is both iconic and convenient, a safe and welcoming environment within walking distance of all the restaurants, boutiques and happenings of exhilarating St Kilda.

Excellent public transport provides fast and convenient access to the heart of Melbourne, with theatres and cinemas, galleries, arcades and world class dining.

Those choosing to berth at RMYS also gain full access to the Squadron's superbly restored historic clubhouse and all its facilities for the duration of their stay.

No matter what the requirements are, the friendly staff at RMYS will do their best to accommodate them.

SAILING PROGRAM

Royal Melbourne Yacht Squadron has one of the most comprehensive sailing programs offered by any club in Victoria.

The Squadron's adults sail keelboats of all shapes and sizes, while juniors enjoy racing off the beach in dinghies. Racing takes place in divisions depending on each boat's individual specifications, and with all craft individually handicapped it makes for invigorating and very close racing.

Traditionally RMYS has been a very active racing club, offering a year-round racing program on Wednesdays and Saturdays, that has now been extended with an active cruising division and growing number of multi-hulls.

The Squadron is renowned for its racing quality and professionalism. Most Saturdays of the year RMYS boats can be seen battling with each other and the elements on Port Phillip. It looks spectacular from the shore; just imagine what it would be like to be out on the water!

With many yachts needing crews of three (or more) there are always owners on the lookout for reliable crew, so for those who cannot afford to buy or run their own boat, this is one of the most cost-effective routes into sailing.

Some series are run in conjunction with our friends at neighbouring clubs providing the opportunity to race against less familiar opponents.

Twilight racing on a Wednesday night during daylight savings is very popular. It's down to the Squadron straight after work for a quick race, followed by dinner and a drink among friendsthe perfect way to break up the monotony of the working week.

In winter, it's the return of the Midweek Mariners on Wednesday, starting at 1400 hours for those able to escape business commitments.

The traditional 'Lady Skippers' Race' has been a long standing feature on the sailing calendar at Royal Melbourne Yacht Squadron. Traditionally the race is open to any yacht as long as it is 'skippered' by a woman. She can have a crew of all males, all females or mixed but a female must helm the boat throughout the whole race.

In 2005 the 'Lady Skippers' Race' was re-named the Jennifer Goldsmith Perpetual Trophy.

The Goldsmith family now sponsors the event in memory of Jennifer Goldsmith, a keen sailor and first female recipient of the Club Member of the Year at RMYS.

The Jennifer Goldsmith Perpetual Trophy is open to yachts from all clubs and is a part of the Port Phillip Women's Championship Series. All entry fees are donated by RMYS to melanoma research.

One of the club's biggest annual events is the Australian Women's Keelboat Regatta. Held over the King's Birthday long weekend in June, it is Australia's premier women's sailing event and is believed to be the first all-women's regatta in Australia. This event celebrated its 31st anniversary in 2023, with a record number of boats and competitors.

There is also the chance to play an active part in club life by learning one of the administrative roles that are indispensable to the smooth running of any club. Without race officers, mark layers and rescue personnel, for instance, there would be no races. The club has a number of qualified race officials who generously give their time on a regular basis to run high-quality racing.



CRUISING

The beauty of sailing is that it has something to appeal to everyone. Ambitious young sailors may hone their skills with the dream of one day following in the footsteps of famous names before them and becoming Australia's next Olympic gold medallist on the water.

An increasing number of sailors both at the Squadron and worldwide are enjoying another side to the sport, cruising.

What is cruising? In essence, it is social sailing. A chance to enjoy a wonderful pastime accompanied by like-minded individuals who enjoy nothing more than spending quality time together on and off the water. Sail together or individually and rendezvous at a chosen destination before savouring some good food accompanied by a glass (or two) of fine wine.

A strong bond exists between the group, and those joining a cruise for the first time quickly find they have a whole new circle of friends.


With a comfortable bed waiting below deck, there are no expensive hotel rooms or drink drive laws to worry about either.

ROYAL MELBOURNE SAIL TRAINING ACADEMY

LEARN TO SAIL

Sailing is a great sport for everyone. It builds physical and personal skills and develops lifelong friends. Virtually any school subject can be related to sailing be it history, geography, maths or science. Early sailing explorers could step onto a modern yacht and recognise most of the equipment. Planning, team building, and responsibility for one's own actions are reinforced.

At RMSTA we try to sail all year even if the weather is sometimes uncertain. From youth to adult everyone can find in our academy a way to learn or to develop his or her sailing skills and knowledge, it is the place for families and children in particular to learn to sail.

During summer – after school, at weekends and over school holidays – we organise more courses as the weather is better, so the Off the Beach Team is alive with children aged seven and upward, along with experienced sailors and coaches to supervise.

Both competitive and social sailing is available.

FOR OUR YOUTH

The club offers the popular Tackers program, which places the emphasis on learning key sailing skills in a safe and fun environment.

Kids don't need to have any sailing experience and they don't need to have their own boat. All the equipment, including life jackets and boats, is provided. The boats used in the Tackers program are small and easy to handle, even for the youngest of children.

Tackers Offers:

- ➤ 20 hours of tuition from qualified Australian Sailing Instructors and Assistant Instructors. This is structured as either a 5-day holiday program or as a series of six individual sessions held over several weeks
- Combination of on-the-water and off-thewater games
- ➤ A certificate of achievement at the end of the course

All three levels of Tackers training are offered at the Training Academy, ensuring a structured pathway for juniors to enable them to become as proficient at sailing as their ability and available time allows. The levels are:

Tackers 1 – Having Fun

Kids sail in pairs in small boats called Optimists. This is a great way to make new friends, play games and be active out on the water whilst learning basic boat handling in a safe environment.

Tackers 2 – Tricks & Techniques

If kids are confident, they can sail a boat on their own with lots of support and encouragement from their Instructors whilst developing important boat handling skills and an understanding of marine rules and safety.

Tackers 3 - Sailing Fast!

In individual boats kids learn how to make the boat go faster and begin to think about sailing tactics and racing with as much guidance and support provided as they need.

FOR OUR TEENAGERS

Young development does not end there, however, as the club offers a follow-on coaching program known as Green Fleet for Tackers graduates who wish to learn how to race most of the time when they become teenagers. Under the tuition of sailing instructors/coaches, Green Fleet members are introduced to junior racing whilst learning higher-level boat handling and having fun with on-water games and exercises. All year our junior squad is training on Sunday to lift up their game and access to national championships and/or jump on our fleet of keelboats.

The squad program is developed in accordance with the parents to make this team also a perfect family time when parents and teenagers can share something during this important time of their life.

At RMSTA we are proud to say that our sailing courses are a part of their personal psychical and mental development; we are mentoring kids to have a better knowledge of themselves.

The club uses Optimists, Pacers and Quest RS for training on St Kilda harbour and Port Phillip, but during holidays we also run with the kids' extra activities like: stand paddle, kneeboard, towed buoy, etc...so they can get used to the sea and discover other potential interest.

FOR ADULTS

RMSTA offers a wide range of nationally recognised learn-to-sail and boating courses from "Discover Sailing" to Crewing and Racing courses in both dinghies and keelboats on our lovely three S80s.

The Training Academy is an accredited Australian Sailing "Discover Sailing Centre" that has launched the sailing careers of thousands. Managed by experienced and nationally accredited sailing and boating instructors, on-water and shore-based courses are conducted throughout the year.

All instructors are qualified through Australian Sailing and place equal importance on safety and enjoyment of the course to create the perfect learning environment.

For the mature student wishing to get into sailing, the courses provide a fun and accessible entry into the sport and provide participants with further opportunities to improve and develop sailing skills and techniques.

For racing sailors, our coaches also develop and deliver special seminars to pinpoint topics very important around the racing area: start, rounding mark, spinnaker, etc...but also we develop courses on specific positions such as jib trimmer and fore deck, incorporating filming and the use of professional software (Adrena, Njord, etc...) to find the keys to lift your game.

Royal Melbourne Sail Training Academy covers all types and levels of boating, ranging from learning to sail a dinghy or yacht to Cruising and Powerboating. In addition, courses are run teaching key skills such as navigating or how to operate a marine radio. Whether a beginner or already highly experienced, there is a level within each program to suit everyone.

For the ones that want to learn to sail "seriously" we have designed a training membership over 12 months. After an interview and expressing your expectation, our coach will build a plan of training for you. Over 12 months you'll do a mix of Discover Sailing courses, special coaching, building miles on members' boats and progress at your own rhythm.

For the ones that plan to rent or to buy a sailing boat we also provide onboard coaching to give you all opportunities to best manage your boat and avoid beginners' mistakes, especially during manoeuvres and berthing.

See below for a summary of the courses available:

- ► Tackers: Learn to sail programs for kids 7 to 12 years
- ► Green Fleet: Junior sailing and learn-to-race programs for kids beyond Tackers
- ▶ Dinghy: Small boat sailing for youth & adults in beach-launched sailing dinghies
- ► Keelboat: Learn to sail programs for adults in larger day sailing yachts such as 580s
- ▶ Powerboat: Powerboat handling courses, including theory, licensing and on-water practical training
- ► Safety Operator: practice and regulation to rescue a boat and the crew
- ► Marine Radio: VHF and HF marine radio handson training courses and licensing
- ► Coastal Navigation: Shore-based courses including traditional chart navigation and GPS

DISCOVER SAILING AT RMYS

Ever fancied trying your hand at sailing, but never been sure where to turn?

Look no further than Royal Melbourne Yacht Squadron.

The club is always delighted to welcome new faces, and there is no friendlier sailing club to be found anywhere.

Wednesdays during daylight savings is the perfect way to sample all that's best about RMYS. Be at the club by 1600, put your name down on the board in the Olympic Bar and get ready for the perfect midweek break, with twilight sailing followed by an equally enjoyable time in the clubhouse.

There is also racing on Wednesday afternoons during winter, though this starts earlier and those interested in taking part need to be at the club by 1200. In either instance it's best to call first.

Skippers are also always looking for willing hands on Saturdays, the busiest sailing day of the week. Start times vary depending on the race of the day, so contact the office to find out what's on this week.

Warm clothing, a waterproof jacket and sturdy shoes with non-marking soles (white is best) are essential, as is some water and sunscreen.

A Sail Pass is available for the modest cost of \$15, which offers the opportunity to enjoy a trip out on one of the regularly raced keelboats, as well as the use of the club facilities upon returning to shore.

The chance to have a drink and some dinner while bonding with the rest of the crew is one not to be missed. Up to 12 Sail Passes can be issued per individual.


By that stage, of course, you're hooked! Should you then decide to take the next logical step and join RMYS, the money already paid for any Day Passes is counted towards the first year of membership.

It is also worth noting that the club holds a Discover Sailing Day each year, a hugely popular event run by volunteer members at the club for newcomers that allows landlubbers to see whether they have sea legs.

The best part about this day, besides getting out on the water, is the chance to meet like-minded people who are also new to sailing. Finding others in the same boat can instantly forge new friendships and make the sailing experience all the more pleasurable.

BECOMING A MEMBER
